- <u>Classes Start</u>: The first day of the fall semester is Monday, August 21st.
 Unless registered for online classes students are expected to be present on the first day.
- <u>Laptop Policy</u>: The University adopted a new "BYOD" (Bring Your Own Device Policy) in 2021. All students are required to have a personal laptop computer to support their college experience. An important reminder that there is a time limit for Graduate and undergraduate courses on all Incomplete grades. After 12 months the "I" will automatically convert to a "U." Incomplete grades that were assigned in Summer 2022 will default to Unsatisfactory at theend of Summer 2023. To avoid suspension or termination the grade must be submitted no later than noon August 14, 2023.

Topics in Geography: Urban Analytics GEOG 4000/5000 Fall 2023 |TR 2:30 - 3:45 pm | Dr. Youngseob Eum

Course Description: Urban analytics is an emerging field that helps improve the understanding, management, and planning of cities by harnessing big data from a wide array of sources, including mobile devices, remote sensing, social media, and government records. This course introduces students to data analytics approaches to dealing with some of the biggest challenges that modern cities face, such as urban sprawl, crime, air pollution, traffic congestion, and socioeconomic inequity. Hands-on practices will help students to be equipped with essential R programming skills and data analytics techniques to collect, manage, and analyze various types of data in order to extract meaningful insights, make informed decisions, and disseminate findings to support urban planning and policymaking.

Prerequisite & Preparation: This course has no formal prerequisite, but working experience in R Programming is assumed.



ChatGPT drafts accurate patient illness summaries

Attending physicians in internal medicine correctly surmised whether a history of present illness notes was generated by ChatGPT or a senior internal medicine resident 61% of the time, according to a research letter published in JAMA Internal Medicine. HPI summaries generated by residents were more detailed, but overall scores differed by a mean of one point on a 15-point scale, and co-author Ashwin Nayak says large language models can "draft clinical notes at a level that we would want as a clinician reviewing the charts and interpreting the clinical situation."

Deep learning may guide Crohn's disease treatment

A deep learning model that analyzes capsule endoscopy videos identified patients newly diagnosed with Crohn's disease who might benefit from biologic therapy, according to a study published in Therapeutic Advances in Gastroenterology. The model detected and accurately graded inflammation indicators in CE images and outperformed a standard scoring system when predicting the need for biologic therapy.

Sherilyn Pruitt, a senior adviser in the Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT, is co-leader of the Public Health Informatics and Technology Workforce Development Program, which aims to train 4,000 people to support public health informatics, data collection and analysis, and bring more people from underrepresented communities into public health IT. The program will diversify the public health workforce and bring people with diverse skill sets who can make policies that lead to healthier populations into public health departments, Pruitt says.
