#### Welcome to 2024! New Year's Resolutions

In this edition, in the spirit of the New Year, I am going to kick off with a list of suggested resolutions for this New Year:

- <u>Audit your degree progress-ASAP</u>. <u>DegreeWorks</u> provides real-time advice for degree progression and planning. Similar to a transcript, it gives UNC Charlotte students access to their plan of study as well as an overall glance of their academic progress. Please review your progress to make sure that all of your courses are being counted properly, and they are not in the "fall-though" category. You may have to submit an academic petition to request that courses be manually slotted into your degree.
- <u>Confirm Registration</u>: Log into your <u>Banner SelfService Account</u> and make sure that you are ready for the spring semester. The last day to add or drop a class without penalty is January 17th. (Payment Information) Please contact your advisor if you have any questions.
- <u>Get connected to campus</u>: We have a wealth of resources for students in the undergraduate and graduate programs. It is vital for your success to access these resources early in your academic programs.
- <u>Career Center</u>: from resume workshops, Career Meet-Ups, Career Treks, Networking Events, Professional Panels, etc., plan a weekly visit to their website and sign up!
- <u>The International Student and Scholar Office (ISSO</u>): The ISSO provides information, services, and programs that help international students and visiting scholars achieve individual educational and personal goals. The ISSO fosters an appreciation for a culturally diverse learning environment in the larger UNC Charlotte community.
- <u>The Reynolds Center for Graduate Life and Learning (CGLL)</u>: As the name suggests, this is a resource specifically tailored to the needs of

Graduate students. The CGLL is located in Atkins directly across from the Career Center. It offers a place to meet and study, professional workshops, social networking opportunities, and writing support.

- <u>Get connected off-campus</u>: As important as the campus community may be, it is even more important to cultivate and grow a professional network in the larger Charlotte community. June 3 – July 26, 2024

The application for SCADS 2024 is now open to students. Student applicants should be currently enrolled in a master's or Ph.D. program. There are no requirements around coursework or specific degree programs. We welcome student applicants from all disciplines interested in the SCADS grand challenge. Students are expected to work 40 hours/week and will receive a competitive stipend of \$10,000. Students who do not already live in the local area (within 35 miles of campus) will also receive a stipend to support local accommodations and travel. <u>Register for an information session</u>. Al is promising, but serious pitfalls exist Artificial intelligence has the potential to improve health care, but Al models are unpredictable and may be trained on data that

is outdated, leading to responses that may overlook new information, writes AMIA Fellow Nephi Walton, associate medical director of Intermountain Precision Genomics. Conflicting guidelines and the individualized nature of health care also present problems for AI, large language models have fabricated data and sources, and people are at risk of losing skills if we become overly reliant on AI, Walton writes. **Full Story: Inside Precision Medicine (12/20)** 

#### **Explainable AI identifies effective antibiotics**

A deep-learning algorithm was used to screen millions of compounds for antibiotic properties, the 283 most promising compounds were tested in preclinical studies, and several novel structural compounds were found to be effective against methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus and vancomycin-resistant enterococci, researchers reported in Nature. The algorithm was designed to be "explainable," enabling researchers to follow its reasoning and understand the biochemistry supporting its results. **Full Story: Scientific American (12/20)** 

Disaggregating racial, and ethnic data would support public health The US Office of Management and Budget's five mandatory racial categories aggregate sometimes disparate populations into broad groupings and left nearly 50 million US residents to select "some other race" on the 2020 Census. The practice has negative consequences for public health and is no longer necessary, as the technology exists to capture ethnic and racial information with greater precision, writes health equity researcher Juan Carlos Gonzalez. 
